Every month we release our GP infographics which can be viewed on our social media, in our reception areas and here on our newsletter. We hope you find these infographics insightful.

In the month of July we:

- Answered 5,427 phone calls
- Issued 22,398 items via prescription
- 3,152 patients had an appointment of which 2,989 were seen face to face
- 1,517 referrals for further care
- Issued 268 fit notes
- Received 6,852 digital requests
- 163 patients did not attend appointments



If you are eligible for both 'flu and Covid 19 vaccines, you should be receiving a letter for your joint Covid-19 and flu vaccination appointment by mid-October.

Get in touch with the surgery if you haven't received a letter by the 16<sup>th</sup> October.



In late October 2024 we will be launching a new service to our patients.

The Electronic Prescribing Service (EPS) means that your prescriptions will no longer need to be printed, signed and collected form the surgery. It will be sent electronically.

The new service is safe and secure, your prescription can not be lost and can be tracked on our system. Electronic prescriptions can be used by most patients and you do not need a smart phone or computer.

If you would like to use EPS please speak with your local pharmacy to notify them you would like to use this service when it launches.

#### September is Sepsis Awareness Month.

Sepsis is a life threatening reaction to an infection. It happens when the immune system overreacts to an infection and starts to damage the body's own tissues and organs. It can be hard to spot the signs of sepsis. There are a lot of possible symptoms.

They can present like symptoms of other conditions, including flu or a chest infection.

## WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

# SYMPTOMS IN CHILDREN

A child may have sepsis if he or she:

- Is breathing very fast
- Has a 'fit' or convulsion
- Looks mottled, bluish, or pale
- Has a rash that does not fade when you press it
- Is very lethargic or difficult to wake
- Feels abnormally cold to touch

# SYMPTOMS IN ADULTS

An adult may have sepsis if they show any of these signs:

Slurred speech or confusion

Extreme shivering or muscle pain

Passing no urine (in a day)

Severe breathlessness

t feels like you're going to die

Skin mottled or discoloured

Call III or contact your GP if you're worried about an infection.
Call 999 or visit A&E if someone has one of the sepsis symptoms.

### JUST ASK "COULD IT BE SEPSIS?"

The UK Sepsis Trust's Sepsis Savvy campaign aims to equip you with the knowledge you need to seek urgent treatment if you suspect you or a loved one has sepsis.

Why you should get Sepsis Savvy

- Sepsis can affect anyone. It doesn't discriminate by age or gender, and while certain people are more at risk, it can affect people who are generally healthy
- Early detection is key: Quick treatment can save lives
- Its easy to learn: In just 5 minutes, you can arm yourself with life saving knowledge.
